


Appeal Regarding the Murder of Gleen 'Glen' WOLFFE



43 year old Gleen Wolffe was employed as a labourer working in the City of Hamilton. He lived alone in the Sandy's parish area. He had a son and he maintained close relationships with him, his son's mother and his own mother. He was an openly homosexual man.

Gleen's family became concerned about his failure to contact them since Thursday, 11<sup>th</sup> November 1999. They went to his home on Heathcote Hill in Sandy's parish on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> November and found him stabbed to death. There was no sign of forced entry. His car was found on Union Street in Pembroke. Gleen was last seen at work on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> November. The 11<sup>th</sup> was a national holiday. Unusually he failed to turn up for work on Friday, 12<sup>th</sup> November.

An active investigation into the murder of Gleen **WOLFFE** is ongoing. Police are appealing for anyone with any information about his murder including anyone who may have seen Gleen on or after Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> November 1999; or anyone who may have heard anything suspicious in the Heathcote Hill area between 11<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup> November 1999 to contact the Serious Crime Unit on 299-4315 or the confidential Crime Stoppers hotline on 1-800-623-8477.
